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## Planning Application News

Here are details on a number of significant planning issues in Ferriby and the surrounding area that are likely to be of interest to villagers. If you have any concerns about a planning application please let the parish council know **as soon as possible** so that your views can be taken into account when it considers its own response.

Relocation of the **Co-Operative store** to The Duke of Cumberland car park – this will not go to planning committee before Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> September. It is not too late to submit comments of support or objection either **\*on-line** or in writing to **Kevin Guy**, quoting reference **12/01013/PLF**.

Application for three dwellings at **Appledene, Nunburnholme Avenue**, has been approved at planning committee.

Application for five dwellings in the grounds of the **Godfrey Robinson Home**, has been approved at planning committee.

Application for 24.5m wind turbine at **Humberfield Quarry** is not yet decided and may still be undecided when this newsletter is circulated in which case comments can still be submitted either **\*on-line** or in writing to the case officer **Tom Booth-Robinson** quoting reference **12/03175/PLF**.

Six hundred houses on **Melton Park** – NO planning application has been submitted but the parish council was notified of the owner's intention to do an exploratory site dig to test ground conditions in August.

The parish council has been informally consulted on a possible planning application to erect ten small business units on agricultural land to the rear of residential properties on the north side of **Ferriby High Road** at the eastern end of the village. The PC has sent comments of concern and advised the agent to consult with local residents before the landowner considers further action

With so much planning activity it is difficult for the parish and ward councillors to circulate details in time for residents to be able to send comments of objection or support if they wish to do so. **We would also like to be able to inform you when ERYC announces which sites it is likely to progress for new housing in the next Local Plan. Details of these sites are likely to become public in December.**

**Both North Ferriby and Swanland have been identified as providing approximately 85 new homes each during the period of the new Local Plan, approximately 20 years.**

**It is important that residents have their say in the consultation period as to where these houses should be located. If you wish to be advised of details, again please ensure that we have your email contact details.**

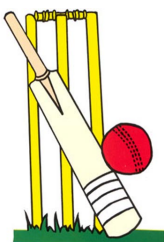
### Committee Vacancy

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## Snippets from Riverside Walkway

The wet weather has resulted in prolific growth on Riverside Walkway this year. The committee will be considering a programme of woodland maintenance at its next meeting and work will soon be undertaken to reduce the number of reeds in the Reed Pond. A wildflower survey has identified 111 different types of flora. The Environment Agency has agreed to provide further planting to the area around the new floodgate in the autumn.

## Overgrown Trees and Shrubs and Autumn Leaves

Perfect growing conditions have meant that many trees and shrubs have encroached onto footways and roads. If vegetation in your garden is likely to cause an obstruction or cause an injury to a pedestrian or cyclist, or even worse should a limb fall from a tree, can you please take some action to reduce the encroachment. Trees in conservation areas or with a protection order need permission for work to be done and you should contact the Trees and Landscape Officer at ERYC.

As we no longer have a street cleaner, it would be really helpful if you could put autumn leaves from the footway outside your home in your brown bin.

## Playing Field

Regrettably there have been further incidents of damage at the skate park. CCTV images have been downloaded and passed to the police.

Work will commence soon after the school holidays to construct a footpath on the playing field. It will be laid from the car park to the children's play area and also to the entrance to the skate park. This will allow use of the facilities without the need to dodge muddy areas near to the gates.

## Message from local Police

The police have noted an increase in theft from insecure motor vehicles in the area, including vehicles parked on private driveways. Please keep vehicles locked whenever they are unattended, even parked up at home.
