The Green and the Blue are coming

December 2005

At last Ferriby is to benefit from the twin recycling bin scheme that much of the East Riding has been using for many months. Each household will be receiving their green bin, for normal household waste, and their blue bin (for paper & magazines and other recyclables) in March/April 2006.

Green bins will be collected weekly and blue bins 4-weekly. Households with 5 or more inhabitants can request a larger green bin and keen recyclers can request more than blue bin. Bins will have to be put at the entrance to properties and assistance will be given on request to anyone unable to put their bins out.

A provisional date of Tuesday 24th January has been given for East Riding Council to hold a roadshow giving information on the wheelie bins. As yet the venue has not been confirmed - residents will be informed by ERYC and details will be posted on the village notice boards.

Meanwhile, Ferriby residents have collected 90 tonnes of green waste in the Green Waste Trial, with a 50% participation rate.

STOP PRESS (Electronic version ONLY)
It will now continue until the stock of white sacks has run-out. A letter will be delivered to all households currently included in the trial with a new timetable.

ERYC is now looking at the results of the Ferriby and Bridlington trials and will formulate its policy on green waste in coming months.

Safety on the Playing Fields

Concerns about the potential for cricket balls to land in the children's play area have been expressed to the Parish Council. We agree that there is a risk for any users of the playing field when a cricket match is in progress as balls could possibly be hit into all areas, including the tennis courts and the Bowls Club. We do not consider that anything can be done to mitigate against this risk except to close the field to all other users at such times. However, we do not believe that this will be in the best interest of the village. We do have public liability insurance and we shall be erecting a sign warning of the possible danger from cricket balls before the season starts again in 2006.

Street Lighting Programme

Our £160,000 street lighting programme has now ended with the completion of the scheme for Woodgates Lane. Thank you for your patience whilst the works have been undertaken and we hope that you are as pleased with the results as we are.
